

You may have heard some details of the curriculum review underway in Alberta. It is an extensive process that will update all of our subjects at all grade levels. While this kind of refreshing of curriculum is a routine process in education, this one is on a larger scale than most and there are a few new wrinkles in how it will look. The K-4 curriculum review is to the point where some schools will be piloting it next year. It is still a draft document as the feedback from those pilots will be incorporated into the final document. 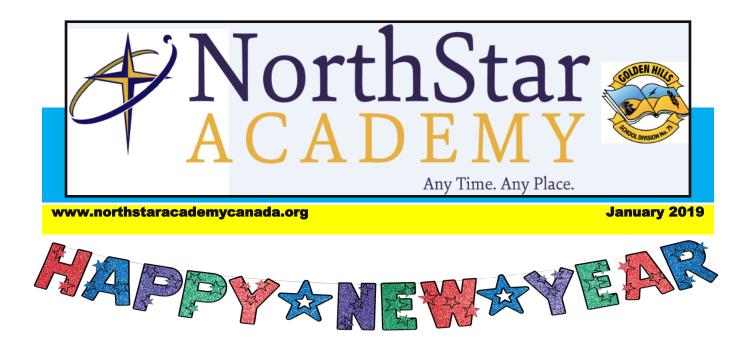

One of the new wrinkles is an emphasis on indigenous history and culture. This is an area that has not been a focus of education in Alberta in the past so the additional attention is a welcome change. Another wrinkle is a move to how the curriculum itself is designed. The K-4, and future documents, is built around a model called Concept Based Curriculum. I don't want to bore you with too much "teacher talk" so I'll give you the short version. Historically curriculum has emphasized knowledge and skills. Concept Based Curriculum adds an additional emphasis on understanding. This emphasis on understanding means going beyond the surface level of knowledge and skills to a deeper level of meaning. This fits very well with the work on critical thinking that we have been engaged in at NorthStar.

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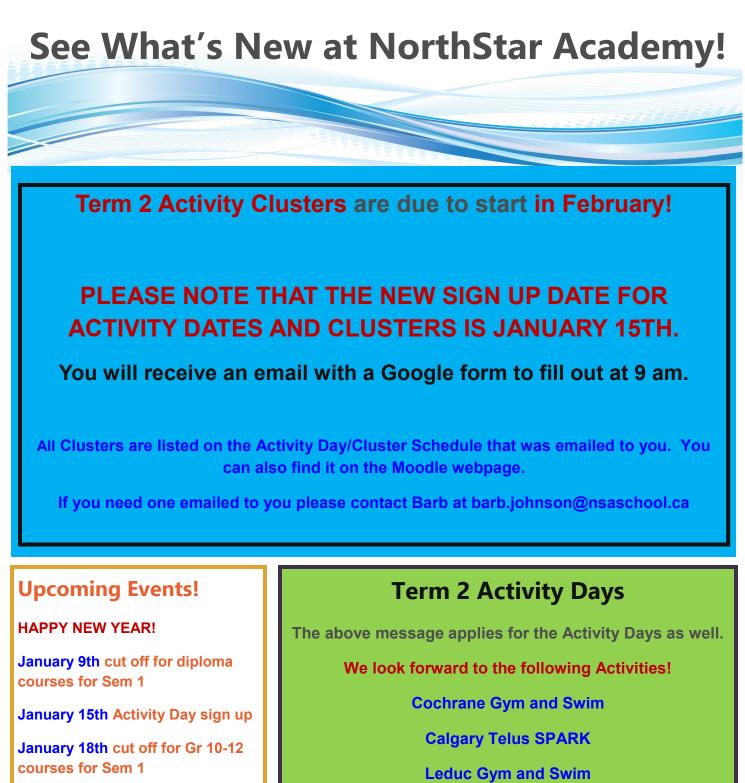

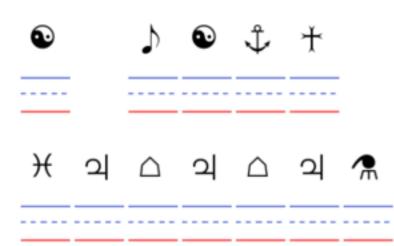

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
