John 16:33 tells us that "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." This sounds pretty easy but as parents many of us tend towards this overly cautious mindset. Some of us grandparents are experiencing this too. My three year old granddaughter Lani is an adventurous spirit with courage to try most anything. At times I find myself watching her like a hawk and repeating the phrase "be careful" over and over again. I hate the thought of her banging herself up as she jumps off the couch but the lessons learned from taking reasonable risks and the bumps that go along with them are important to her becoming a resilient and capable person. A person who is not afraid to follow Christ as there are costs to being a disciple.
