Fortress Mountain Resort

Here's another mountain many skiers fondly recall. Fortress Mountain had about 700 meters of vertical, 3,311 skiable acres, and five ski lifts. An exemplary base lodge met skiers at the bottom, with an iconic fireplace. Though Fortress is long closed as a ski centre, a new owner is making plans to revive the resort, and eventually reopen it.

Fortress opened as Snowcrest in 1967, founded by David Bullock, with his two brothers, Evan and Curtis. The hill had five lifts, snowmaking equipment, and a hostel in among the rafters of the iconic base lodge.

Over the years, it changed hands multiple times, ranging from Aspen Resorts, to Resorts of the Canadian Rockies. In 2004, RCR evaluated the resort, and decided that, due to poor snow conditions, poor infrastructure, and a lack of reinvestment potential, they would shutter the resort. The following September, the mountain was sold to Banff Rail Co, who planned to reopen the mountain. But it never happened. Then, in 2007, the province pulled the lease that Banff Rail Co. had on fortress, citing the dangerous bridge that Banff Rail Co. had failed to fix.



However, in 2011, a new owner is making grand plans to reopen the resort. Fortress Mountain Holdings began a snowcat operation in 2011, that somewhat re-opened the mountain. The resort also got a big boost when the film "Inception" was shot at Fortress, allowing for the unsafe bridge to be fixed. The resort hopes to have an all new base lodge, and mostly new lift fleet for the 2021 ski season.

This month's topic "Covid-19"

What was supposed to be a single country's epidemic was just announced a worldwide pandemic, however, citizens in many countries are still acting controversial to what the government is calling "goodwill". Some are acting swiftly on the matter with self quarantine and stocking up to prepare for a highly possible official government enforced quarantine, while others are heading out on March break, causing the disease spread to increase. The reason for this controversy is because of the amount of distrust people have in their government. Stats for deaths and infection rates are not lining up with what research facilities are discovering and doctors are told not to tell the public about what they know, to reduce panic.

According to research facilities, the Coronavirus originated as a mutated version of the virus that came from bats. Many theories have rolled the internet; whether or not the virus naturally occurred to be spliced with SARS and Aids. Some believe that this virus was created as a bio-weapon, but many international research facilities have turned these theories down. They claim that an exotic animal could have encountered a bat carrying the virus, was cross contaminated into the food market and from there was naturally joined and grown into Covid-19. Research is still needing to be done before putting these theories and cases to rest and before coming to an official conclusion.

What makes Covid-19 extremely dangerous is how hard it is to identify. Mostly among young people, the virus comes off as a simple flu or cold. However, when older people, respectively 21-90, come into contact with the virus, the reactions can be very deadly.

Many people are not overly affected the first time they are sick with the virus, which lead many people to believe the virus is not serious. But after supervising patients, it is seen that when that person gets the virus a second or third time, they are extremely affected. In China, when people were exposed to the virus a second time, they have devastatingly dropped dead in the streets approximately three days after their second exposure. The virus affects each person that it meets differently; your genetics, gender, and blood type can tell you a little on how much you could be affected by the virus.



According to some research males are the most affected when in contact with the virus, blood type O is seemingly the least affected, and Chinese and Africans are seemingly the most affected by the virus. These results have yet to be tested in a few more countries and research facilities for more information to be unlocked, but its good to be discerning to what we know so far.

Something that people should know, is when the officials say that you can't create an immunity towards the virus, this doesn't mean you won't get sick. It may seem right now that Canadians are on the safer side, however, what hurts other countries should open our eyes.
