#### From the Principal's Office



The new semester is upon us for our grade 10-12 students and we are getting a touch of real winter as it has been a pretty mild one so far. Final exams are usually as predictable as cold weather in a prairie winter, but this year has been unusual. First Alberta Education made diploma exams optional which resulted in nearly every student in the province choosing not to write. Secondly, school boards around the province decided to do "hold harmless" final exams for grades 11 and 12. This means course grades could go up but not

down based on the final exam results. This move came late in the semester so that our students were already in the process of writing or had completed their final exams. Our school division determined to apply this "no risk" strategy to grade 10-12 students for comprehensive final exams as not doing so would have placed our students at a disadvantage when compared to others in the province. Our teachers applied this concept to their semester 1 courses. Student's whose grade would have decreased because of a final exam result were exempted from that final exam. Those whose marks went up had the final exam included.

Congratulations are due to Mrs. Shaylene Dykema on the birth of Preston James – 8 lbs and 11 oz. Shaylene and her husband Stefan have two girls so I'm sure this little fellow is a welcome addition.
