
It's that time of year again where the shops are decked out with bats and pumpkins, and everything smells like cinnamon and candy apples. It is autumn! Autumn is one of my absolute FAVOURITE months to go tea shopping because there are so many cinnamon and chai flavours which are totally the best.

In these articles, I will show you some of the new teas coming out for Halloween, where to get them and a little description of what they are like. I might also add in a recipe for a special type of tea! So, with no further ado, let's get started!

Tea #1: Pumpkín Crème Brulée by DavídsTea

Pumpkin crème is a delicious, creamy, fruit infusion of pumpkin and white chocolate. I found since it was a fruit infusion it took a while to steep. On the box, it says to steep for 5+ minutes and I went to about 7 and the water was barely coloured. The longer you steep it the richer the flavour is of the pumpkin and the white chocolate so I suggest you go as long as you can before you can't handle the wait anymore. ⁽³⁾ But don't worry even if the water is still really light you will be able to taste it, it is just because this tea is a fruit infusion instead of one with a lot of leaves and such. This tea doesn't need a lot of sugar and I didn't add any cream and it was great but I am pretty sure it would taste awesome with it too. For a description of the flavour I would say it is definitely rich and creamy. It totally tastes like pumpkin herbal tea and the white chocolate is definitely noticeable. A Waste of an Election and a Dark Future for Canadians

On Monday, September 20th, 2021, Canadians anxiously awaited the results of the 44th General Federal Election. Our bewilderment over the outcome has been widespread. Trudeau and the Liberal Party of Canada once again seize power with a total of 158 seats as of September 21st, out turning in a Liberal minority government. Although the party appears unperturbed, the end result was far from what the party had envisioned. In mid-August, Trudeau called a snap election in the hopes of achieving a Liberal majority. However, there were only the slightest changes from the previous election. After coming out on top with 33.12% popular vote in 2019, the Liberals are now down to 32.24 % by the September 2021 election. The Conservative Party lost 0.36% popular vote since the last election, moving from 34.34% to 33.96%. Most likely, the loss was a migration to the PPC, which scored 5.09% of the popular vote, over 3 times higher than their 1.62% in 2019(1).


All parties failed to achieve their goals in this election, leaving everyone in a rut. The Liberals, along with the Conservatives, aimed for a majority government, while the Green Party and PPC grappled to attain a single seat. Although NDP's popularity increased by 1.73%, they only won one seat more than in the previous race. There have been no significant changes to the House of Commons, which is a loss for everyone involved. Resulting in \$610 million Canadian tax dollars wasted, a record-breaking amount ever to be spent on a Canadian election.

What is to be expected in this next term? From the most resent projections, the slippery slope is only downhill from here. A Calgary Harold article recaps the economic downturn Trudeau's government has already caused, saying "In the past four years, Canada's federal government debt has more than doubled to \$1.4 trillion" (2), and then estimates the further debt to be caused based off of Trudeau's words, saying "the federal Liberal Party released its costed election platform detailing how it would spend an extra \$78 billion over five years — or an additional \$15.6 billion per year" (2). The strain on the Canadian economy will be massive, perhaps to the point of no recovery.

The Liberal government has failed to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic in an appropriate fashion, which will continue into this next term. The locking down of the country resulted in the harm of many citizens which was not factored in by the government. Such as a massive spike in opioid deaths in 2020, which can be found on the Government of Canada website, which reads "Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, 5,148 apparent opioid toxicity deaths occurred (April to December 2020), representing a 89% increase from the same time period in 2019 (2,722 deaths)" (3) This reveals the fact that the Liberal Government's ability to deal with important issues is questionable, projecting a darker future for Canadians.
