Change is on the Horizon: A New Era for the Canadian People

Change is seizing hold of Canada. The nation has erupted into protests, COVID-19 mandates are being fast-tracked to their end, and our economy continues on its steep slope into the ground. The next several months will be a rollercoaster, as our fractured and diluted government will either collapse entirely or fasten itself together.

On January 29th, 2022, over 50 000 trucks descended on the nation's capital. The convoy has come to be known as The Freedom Convoy, gathering from every corner of the country to protest the widespread COVID-19 mandates.

Before the existence of the convoy, the largest convoy recorded was 7.5 km in length, taking place in Egypt in 2020. Over 70 km, The Freedom Convoy is now the largest convoy in history and nearly ten times the length of the former record. In an attempt to disperse the frenzy of trucks, the government has downplayed the protesters as far-right extremists. Our own prime minister, Justin Trudeau, stated, "The small fringe minority of people who are on their way to Ottawa, who are holding unacceptable views that they are expressing, do not represent the views of Canadians." Canada has a population of 38 million, with 50 000 trucks in Ottawa and several thousand protesters on foot, the convoy is hardly a "small fringe minority". That is excluding the protesters along the highways and protesters in their hometowns and excluding the convoy blockades in four major points of entry into the United States. Many public figures from around the world have come out in full support of the convoy, figures include Joe Rogan, Elon Musk, Russel Brand, Jordan Peterson, and even the former duly-elected president of the United States, Donald Trump. The convoy has inspired change, rippling throughout Canada and now worldwide. Convoys now exist in multiple countries including Brazil, Australia, and Italy, protesting their own government's overreaching mandates. Within our own border, a difference is being made and change is on the horizon.

Provincial COVID-19 mandates have been lifted in a desperate attempt to snuff out the flames of the freedom protests. Saskatchewan was the first to announce the opening of the province, with Alberta and Ontario following suit. Notwithstanding, citizens continue to protest until all government mandates – federal, provincial, and municipal – dissipate or are repealed.

Further issues have been catalyzed by protests, such as the forcible resignation of Erin O'Toole as the leader of the Conservative party of Canada. Candice Bergen, now serving as the interim leader of the party while an upcoming election is in the works. A new hope emerges for Conservatives as an augment popular figure has announced his campaign, Pierre Poilievre. Poilievre intends to become the leader of the Conservatives, furthermore, the Prime Minister of Canada. He, like many Canadians, is now calling for the resignation of Justin Trudeau, which has resulted from Canadian's fragmented trust in the Liberal leader. Politics in Canada is shifting, we can only hope that the state of our economy can shift with it.

It does not take an economist to point out that our economy is failing. With massive amounts of inflation and low amounts of quantitative easing, prices are skyrocketing. CBC reports that nearly \$220 has been added to the monthly grocery bills of a typical Albertan family in 2021 alone. Perhaps if your family has been looking at moving, or a member of your family is in the real estate market, you've seen how outrageous housing prices have become. In Canada, almost a third of 18 to 34 year-olds still live with their parents because they don't have enough money for housing. We are sliding down a steep slope. If our economy doesn't change soon, we will find ourselves amidst the next Great Depression.

New hope has arisen for the Canadian people as change dawns on the horizon, but there is still much work to be done. After COVID-19, there is no returning to normal. It has torn into our daily lives and changed the way by which we live, but perhaps we can build back Canada better than it once was. I encourage you to stand up and fight for your beliefs, use your voice and be heard, and build a nation to be proud of.

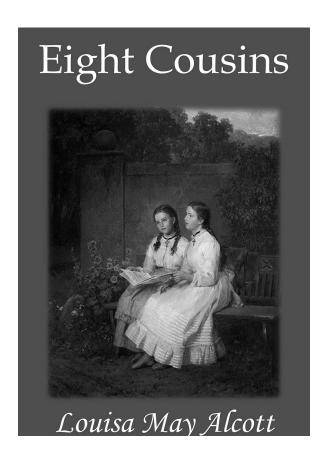

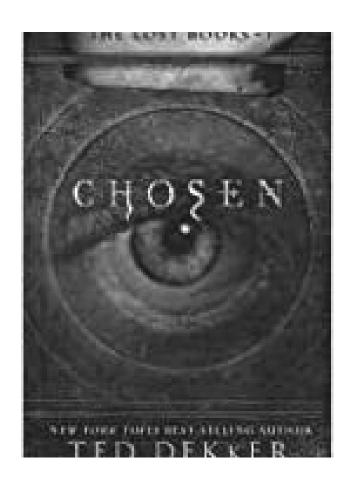

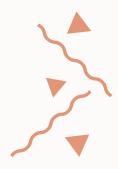

Today's Recipe: Stovetop Pizza

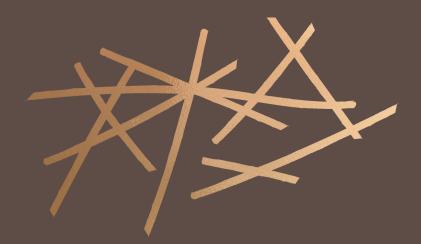
Its that esay!

Current news, which for some of you is the later news, this month's topic "State, Nation, & International Affairs".

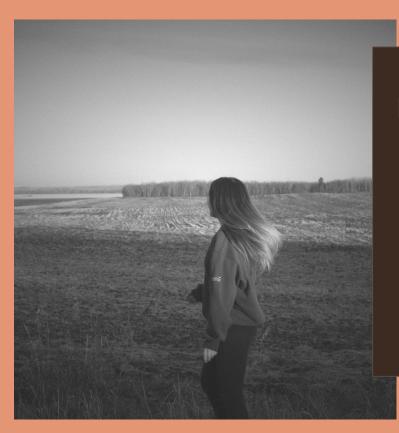
Albertan News: As of February ninth, of 2022 many of the covid restrictions including the exemptions program (also known as the vaccine passport system) have been dropped. Youth under thirteen will no longer have to wear masks as of February 14 2022 in any setting, and all students between kindergarten to grade 12 will not be required to wear masks at school. Though the biggest change will come on March first of this year when all restrictions excluding isolation and social distancing are no longer required. With hospitalizations decreasing it is looking like a hopeful spring, these release on restrictions will be pursued as long as cases and hospitalization decrease in Alberta.



Canadian News: Mostly everyone knows about the trucker's protest at this point, though there is much hype and controversy surrounding this topic there is a few other things happening for Canada. This past winter has shown heavy snow fall all across Canada and it looks like there is now some heavy snow over in P.E.I as well as Nova Scotia, so much snow that school is cancelled for students in grade school and university! As of February 14, Canada has won 1 gold medal, 6 silver medals, and 9 bronze medals in the 2022 Beijing winter Olympics. 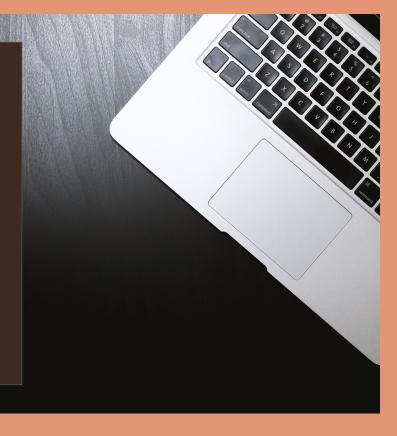
