From there, we will contact you by June 15th, regarding acceptance. Priority will be given to NorthStar students first. Please Note:

- Summer school is available for Gr. 10-12 students
 only. Students currently in Gr. 9 (going into Gr. 10 in
 the fall), may apply for one Gr. 10 summer school
 course.
- Students may only apply for one summer school course.
- 30-level diploma courses are **not** offered in our summer school session.
- Summer school runs for approximately three weeks in July. Summer school is a very short timeframe, and students will be expected to complete their course during this timeframe.
- Fees: We charge a \$50 application fee per summer school student (if accepted). Plus the cost of shipping & consumable resources, if the course requires it. If a student is continuing a course from semester 2, a \$200 continuation fee will be charged.

Limited Submission Period Policy

Why?

Once upon a time, most of our teachers worked part time. When the end of semester came and the students who were behind handed in a lot of assignments, we would increase our hours to get grading and report cards complete in time for our deadlines. As our student body grew and more teachers started working full-time, we found that a teacher can no longer double their hours at the end of semester (and still sleep and maintain healthy life balance). To balance the needs of teachers to survive the end of year rush and the needs of students who have found themselves behind in their courses, we now allow students to hand in as much as they can up to the night before the start of the last two weeks of class. That gives teachers two weeks to mark that avalanche of assignments and in each of those last two weeks, students may hand in up to two lessons' worth of work.

HOME ENVIRONMENT AND LEARNING IDEAS FOR PARENTS

Help! I need to plan for next year!

It is that time again when you are making decisions about school programming for next year. When you are also managing learning challenges, it can often be challenging to know what to do.

NorthStar affords many benefits to students with specific learning needs. Providing multiple program options and meaningful instructional accommodations allows students to thrive in an educational environment designed for their learning success.

Looking at our four programming options, each one offers a different opportunity to accommodate student learning needs.

Does your child need more structure and accountability? Our *online program* (Grades 5 to 12), as a teacher-directed program based on Alberta's provincial curriculum, offers students greater structure and accountability.

Does your child need more choice and flexibility? Our *print-based resource program* (Grades 1 to 12), also a teacher-directed program based on Alberta's provincial curriculum, offers students greater flexibility. Student learning resources are chosen from a recommended list.

Does your child need to pursue their own interests? Our *home education program* (Grades 1 to 12), as a parent-directed program, does not require students to meet the outcomes of Alberta's provincial curriculum. It offers parents the ability to customize their student's program based on their specific learning needs and interests. A teacher facilitator is assigned to help support parents through this process.

Maybe your child needs a bit of everything, depending on the subject area. Our *shared responsibility program* (Grades 1 to 12), as a blend of our teacher-directed and parent-directed programs, offers students the opportunity to pursue their individual learning interests in some subject areas, while working towards the fulfillment of the provincial curricular requirements in others.

Living in an Anxious Age

Have you found yourself struggling with periodic fears, unrealistic worries, or crushing anxiety? If so, know that you are not alone! Everywhere I go, I encounter individuals who are battling anxiety in different ways. I, myself, am not immune to this struggle! I don't know exactly what you are facing right now... you could be anxious about your workload, your friends, your family, your job, your health, your future, your safety, or a variety of other stresses. Whatever the case may be, I want to share with you some strategies I find helpful when I am trying to trust in the Lord and think rightly about a particular situation or relationship.

- 1. **Dwell on what is Good and Beautiful** spend time focusing on the positive things in your life, the truth of God's Word, and the beauty of His creation (count your blessings) instead of spending the majority of your time thinking about what is going wrong or stressing you out in your world.
- 2. **Grace Spot** look at all the ways other people are evidencing the grace of God in practical ways instead of getting wrapped up in the negative things that people are doing around and to you. Once you notice these graces, share them! Speak life and encourage others!
- 3. Read the Word of God and Focus on Trusting in God's Promises "Children need to be reminded that God is in charge of everything happening in our world. Also, God did not promise us that only good things will happen. Bad things happen too because we live in a broken and sinful world. The absolute truth is this: in good times and bad times, God is in control. 1 Peter 1:6 reminds us that as God's children we will suffer grief in all kinds of trials, including sicknesses. But our response to these things will show that our faith is genuine. This truth should drive the children to depend on God who knows everything. God's Word also gives us hope when Paul says, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us" (Romans 8:18). Help children to trust that God is with them even in the midst of difficulties, and one day all suffering will end when Christ returns." ~ Dudu Mkhize (https://africa.thegospelcoalition.org/article/helping-anxious-children-to-trust-god/)
- 4. **Talk and Share your Heart and Struggles** It is so important to find a trusted parent or friend to share your struggles with. We need community! Do not try to run this race alone. Be vulnerable with someone you can trust. Depend upon the care and support others can offer.
- 5. **Pray** Ultimately, God is in control of your mind, heart, and life. We need to humbly ask God to renew our hearts and minds, give us a greater love for our Lord, and help us comprehend his great love for us. The closer we are to our loving God, the farther we will be from our worldly worries.
- 6. **Have Grace with Yourself** We are all humans. Anxiety is a natural response to living in this sinful world. We need to strive to cast all our cares upon the Lord (1 Peter 5:7), but we also need to understand that we will never do this perfectly in this life. That is why we need God's grace provided through Jesus's sacrificial work on the cross to save sinners. If we have received this grace, we need to live in this grace. Be gentle with yourself as you battle with and through anxiety.
