


The home schooling community in Alberta has recently been impacted by the closure of Trinity/WISDOM. These events have taken parents by surprise and disrupted a learning community that has been in place for many years. Homeschoolers across the province are feeling a bit unsettled, which is very understandable with what has been in the media. One of the big concerns Alberta Education has identified is what they have called "third party delivery of education". This is about the relationship between the operating authority and teachers – whether the teachers work for the operating authority or a second party. Alberta Education has indicated there are four or five homeschool organisations that operate under this model. Some of our families have asked about NorthStar Academy and whether this issue relates to us. It does not. We are operated as an alternate program under the Golden Hills School Division. All of our teachers and support staff are under direct employment contracts with GHSD, which is the model Alberta Education apparently wants for all homeschooling providers.

To keep you updated on how this is affecting us, let me share with you that the superintendent of Golden Hills School Division, our operating authority, has directed us to welcome any and all WISDOM families – a direction we are most happy to follow! We have already received a number of student transfers and many calls and visits from families trying to determine if NorthStar Academy could be a new home for them. Many of the WISDOM families are waiting to hear the results of an appeal/challenge of the closure before making the move to a new school so we anticipate further inquiries and registrations in the coming days.

Please join us in praying for these families who are experiencing this disruption and loss of community as they are now unexpectedly having to reach out to new organisations to assist them in educating their children – not a great place to be this far into the school year.





Creating Community at NorthStar Academy

I start with the premise that the parents are responsible for the education of their children. They may ask some institution like NSA to help with that task. We then become the servants of the parents and it is our job to help them educate their children. We do not want to take the parents out of the picture so it is our job to make sure that we are doing what they need and want. We may have special skills and training to help in the task but we can never say that we know better than the parents what is best for the child.

That being said, we as a school must make sure that the parents are heard and understood. For that reason community is very important. How best to do that in the broader sense of the school with the parents is rather difficult. I believe it is my job to develop a relationship with each of the parents of the children that I teach. Without a relationship, there is no dialog.
