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

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Principal's Message

Have you ever found yourself hitting somebody with a message from Scripture and then the very thing you were preaching about comes to pass in your own life? Last month my newsletter message had to do with us believers being called to keep our lives in balance. Here is the Scripture lesson I was sharing. Psalm 16:8 "I have set the Lord always before me" and John 16:33 which can be summarized as - In this world, trouble; In me, peace.

My Christmas holidays included three trips to Edmonton (helping out with a new grandbaby, Christmas celebrations with family, and moving my Mom and sister to a new house). Along the way we made four trips to the hospital to see my estranged father who is in palliative care in Camrose, we made three trips to Calgary to take my wife's elderly father to visit her oldest brother who is in hospital with Miller – Fischer Syndrome (a weird neurological disorder) and we ended up coming home with my father's dog that my brother was supposed to look after (minor family discord at work). Boy did I need to hear my own preaching. Without a commitment to "set the Lord always before me" it is easy to become overwhelmed with the events we encounter. I came pretty close a couple of times as I tried to wrestle with all the adventures. It really helped when I plugged a CD into the car stereo and listened to Luke's version of the Christmas story. I also spent some time in the book of Daniel where Nebuchadnezzar was set to kill all the wise men of Babylon if they couldn't tell him his dream and interpret it. Daniel went to his friends and together they pleaded "for mercy from the God of heaven concerning this mystery". In spite of the real trouble surrounding them ("I will have you cut into pieces and your houses turned into rubble"), rather than the inconveniences of snow and cold I experienced, they found peace in God. The Lord used these verses to help me stay centered.

May all of our students who are looking at major exams in January have a sense of calm knowing that if they "set the Lord always before me" they can experience God's peace in spite of the troubles of the world (I guess exams could be considered trouble). May you all experience God's blessings a new in 2014.

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Bible Memory

January: God is Light

I John 1:1-10

I That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life. 2 The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us. 3 We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. 4 We write this to make our joy complete.

5 This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. 6 If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. 8 If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 10 If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.


