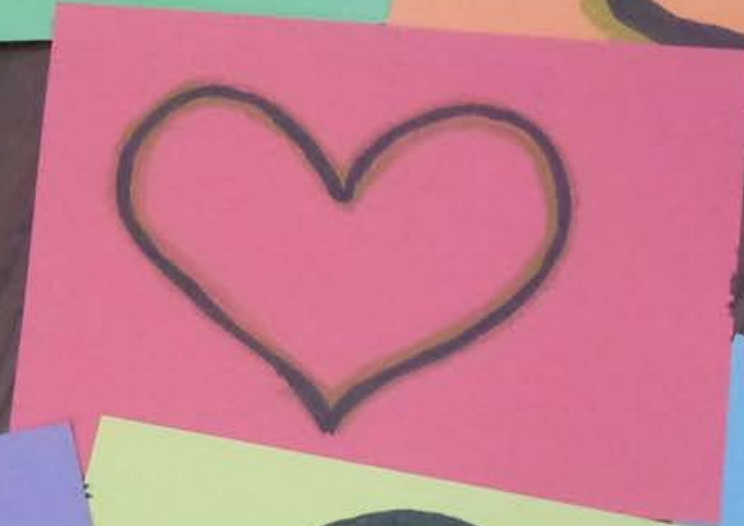



**Answer:** There is no easy answer to this question because of all the different classifications of computers. The first mechanical computer created by Charles Babbage doesn't really resemble what most would consider a computer today. The word "computer" was first recorded as being used in 1613 and was originally was used to describe a human who performed calculations or computations. The Turing machine was first proposed by the Alan Turing in 1936 and became the foundation for theories about computing and computers. The machine was a device that printed symbols on paper tape in a manner that emulated a person following a series of logical instructions. Jemma: What is the most common ice cream flavour?

It started through pain



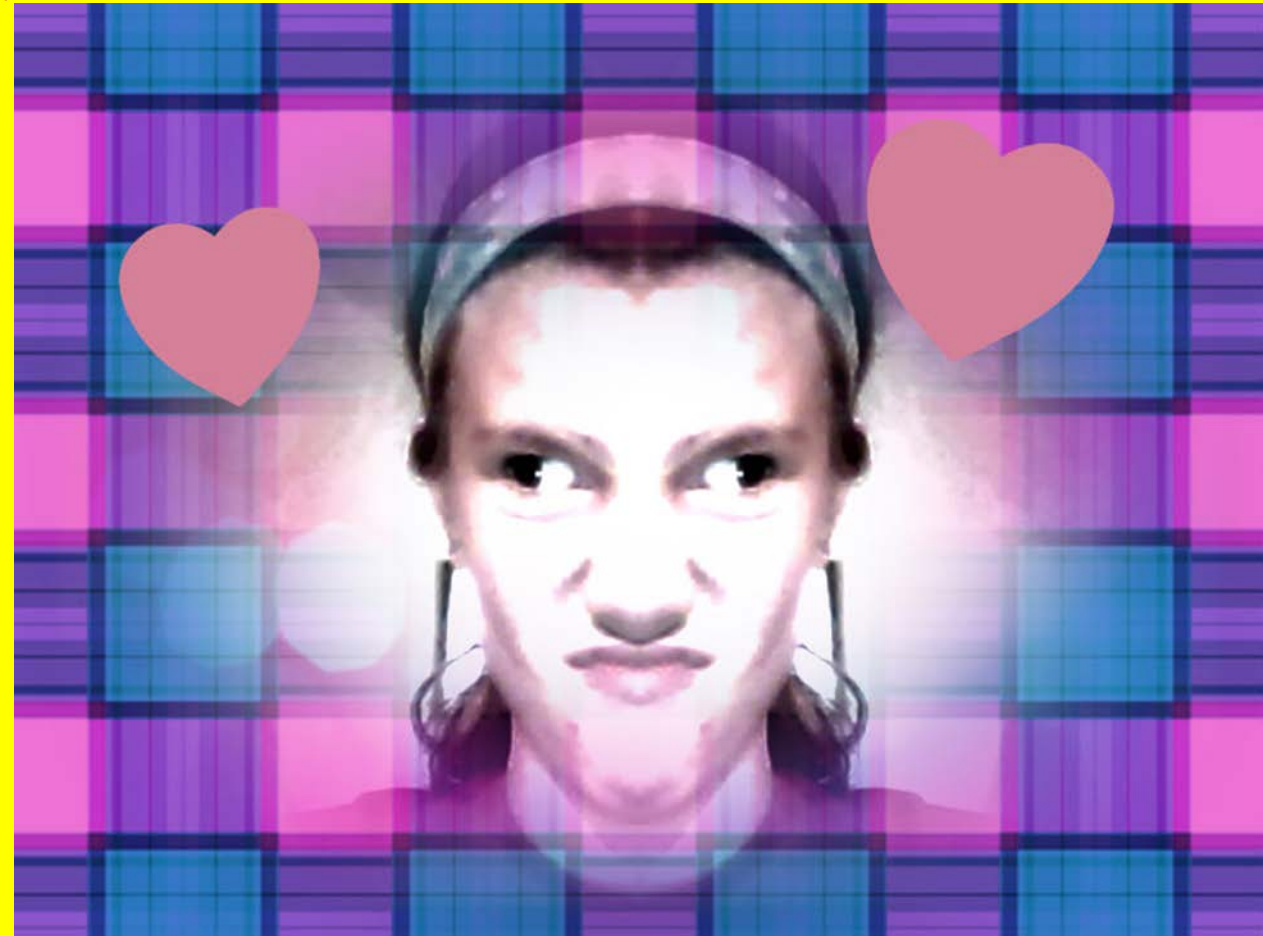

# Polynesian Chicken

This is a very good recipe! I enjoyed it very much! I have had it a few times and I have enjoyed it. It is very good but I can't take the credit for finding the recipe. Hope you enjoy!

3 pound of chicken thighs, cut into serving pieces

1/2 cup of white vinegar

1/2 cup soy sauce

1/4 tsp peppercorns, crushed

1 tsp brown sugar

5 garlic cloves crushed

3 bay leaves

Salt to taste

Combine all ingredients in a pan, cover and allow to marinate one to three hours. Bring to a boil, then lower the heat and simmer for 30 minutes. Uncover the pan and allow to simmer for an additional 15 minutes.



# Apple Crisp

Apple Crisp has to be one of my all-time favorite deserts! I like to add milk or ice-cream to mine. But it can't just be any apple crisp, this recipe is great! Hope you enjoy!

6 cups of apple slices

1 tablespoon lemon juice

2 tablespoons maple syrup

1/4 cup raisins

1/4 cup chopped walnuts

2 tablespoons apple juice (optional)

## Toppings

1/2 cup oats

1/2 cup whole wheat flour

3 tablespoons canola oil

3 tablespoons sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp salt

1 tsp baking powder

Mix topping set aside.
