Principal's Message

What a privilege it is for us at NorthStar to be able to work with you. The political message in the province recently has featured talk of putting barriers between schools and parents. We are so thankful that we get to work with families, not just students. Kids learn best when they are in a safe, caring environment where they can take risks and try new things. When the NorthStar staff and you at home are both working to make this a reality, good things happen. Our back to school barbeque was a great success I hear. I was unable to attend as I was at a family wedding helping to corral the grandkids while my wife played piano for the ceremony. The staff told me there were many great conversations as they got a chance to meet new families and reconnect with old ones (maybe it's better to say returning families as many of you are much younger than us!).

Our first large Activity Day of the year went well, except for the chilly weather. Our focus now moves to indoor adventures for both the large Activity Days and for our Activity Clusters (the short term courses being offered in various areas around the province). This split for our activities program is a new venture for us, designed largely to assist our Teacher Directed families to access more learning activities. We would appreciate your feedback as to how these changes have worked for you so that we can see if adjustments to the program are needed.

Change in education is a constant. One of the newest is the adjustment that Alberta Education has made to the credits senior high students can earn. Alberta Education has reduced the cap for credits from 60 per year to 45. This means we are only funded for up to 45 credits per senior high student. If students take more credits than that, we receive no additional funds. This change represents a challenge for us and for many rural students. Smaller schools do not offer the same class multiple times in a school year. It is routine for rural students to need to take a class or two through an online school like ours when they can't get the class they need at their local school. Now when a student from another school comes to us we have to assess whether or not that student is at their credit maximum before we can offer a class to them. While this change should not have an impact on most of our senior high kids, it could for those who desire to take a very broad selection of courses. Summer school is also included in this 45 credit maximum so we are looking carefully at that program and seeking input from Alberta Education. Interesting times!

One thing that does not change in education is the importance of relationships. James Cormer, a prominent American educator says, "No significant learning can occur without a significant relationship". At NorthStar we are working hard to enhance our relationship with our students and their families. The teachers are training on how to make instructional videos where our students can see and hear us as we teach. We are testing out programs like Flipgrid, a video discussion platform, and we are looking at best practices across the distance education industry on how to engage students. It is an exciting time here at NorthStar with fantastic opportunities to serve you. We pray for our families at every staff meeting. Let us know how we can be a support to you as together we educate your children for eternity.


